You will be advised if the activity results in a change in well number; and

(2) a separate application is required for any activity not specifically covered by this consent which would include, but is not limited to, activities such as an extended well test; and

(3) in accordance with section 4A(1) *Petroleum Act 1998*, (a) associated hydraulic fracturing is prohibited from taking place in land at a depth of less than 1000 metres; and (b) associated hydraulic fracturing is prohibited from taking place in land at a depth of 1000 metres or more unless the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (or his / her successor in title) has provided consent for it to take place.
